The four major plays for next year are set (so long as we get the performing rights for one of them)

Once again, Selection Committee has deliberated long and hard to make sure that the program is varied in content and style and that most of our audiences play type preferences are met.

We begin the year with *This Way Up* by Elizabeth Coleman, directed by Jane Sheppard and Melinda Park. This is a modern, fast paced Australian comedy by the writer of the hilarious and successful play *Secret Bridesmaids Business*. Season dates are 27 February—13 March directed by Suzanne Matulich. From the writer of *Rosencrantz and Guildenstern are Dead*, this is a light hearted look at the trials and tribulations of an endearing, slightly eccentric man and his affect on his family and friends. From the director of *ART* and *President Wilson in Paris*. Season dates 30 April—17 May.

Play number three is **Sex Drugs and Rick 'n' Noel by David Tristram, directed by Doug Moses.** This is an hilarious yet poignant study of two students studying history, and a whole lot else, at University from the author of *Ghost Writer.* Season dates 2—19 July.

Following this is our **54th One Act Play Festival**, once again inviting theatre groups from all over South East Queensland to enter their one act plays for adjudication and hopefully well deserved prizes. The adjudicator is yet to be confirmed but the director is Suzanne Matulich and the dates are 8 - 10 August.

There is a short season available from 24—26 August for an experimental play but this has not yet been finalized.

Our next play is *Three Days* of *Rain* by Richard Greenburgh, directed by Lee Gerchow. This touching and intriguing Pulitzer Prize nominated play is brought to you by the director of *After the Ball, Money and Friends* and *Honour.* Season dates are 1-18 October.

The last play in our 2008 program is *Rumors* by Neil Simon, director Robyn Flashman. This mad farce, written by Neil Simon, America's most prolific and successful comedy playwright will provide an end of year night of laughs.
