Our New President — David Austin

After Ice Dancing for nine years, David gave up the sport and was looking for a new endeavour. His friend, Relle Scott, told him about ILT, and they both went to a theatre night hosted by Suzanne Matulich in 1991. Suzanne told Relle and David about an audition for *And Then There Were None*. directed by Les Chappell.

Before the audition, Relle said to David, "Wouldn't it be funny if they just gave you a role", and that is exactly what happened. He was given the role of Anthony Marsden, as he was the only 20 year old at the audition.

Since then he went on to perform the roles of Garson Hobart in Norman, Is That You?, Prince Richard in The Lion In Winter, Doug in Cosi and Golly in Ritual For Dolls for the Festival Circuit. He was also asked to write plays for the Daytimers. He wrote The Little Mermaid, directed by Jan Paterson, and Beauty and the Beast which was his first directing gig.

David then went on to join Ipswich Orpheus Chorale (IOC). At IOC he performed the roles of Billy Crocer in Anything Goes, Professor Higgins in My Fair Lady and Macavity in CATS. It was at IOC that David really got into directing. He directed The Mikado, Jesus Christ Superstar, Nunsense, Nunsense 2: The Second Coming, Nunsensations, The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee and CATS. In between all of this, he still kept in touch with ILT. He directed Steel Magnolias; and was directed by Robyn Flashman, and performed with Patti Pratt, in The New Quixote.

After a couple of years of rest, from doing all the above, David came back to the stage in *Sex, Drugs, Rick and Noel* directed by Doug Moses. This was David's first time on the ILT stage in a long time, and for him, it was like a homecoming. It was during this time that David decided to join the ILT Committee, and became a member of the Selection Committee.

Since then, David wrote and directed *The Force and I*, a Star Wars Theatre Restaurant; directed *The Importance of Being Earnest*, a play very close to his heart; and recently performed the role of Col. Jessup in *A Few Good Men* directed by Shane Mallory. He is also a helper for S-Troupe directed by Melinda Park. All this has led him to the position of President, and he hopes that 2014 will be another great year for ILT.


