

On Saturday 9 November, we hosted a special event when retired Metallurgical Engineer Jim Happ presented a talk on the Reverberatory Incinerator



and Engineering Company (RIECO) and the installation of the Burley Griffin Incinerator in Ipswich. There was a very pleasing attendance of 55 members and supporters but, regrettably, no representation from Ipswich City Council.

President Jim presented presenter Jim with a token of our thanks.

By a strange coincidence, the next day the Sunday Mail, in its weekly column Way We Were by Jane Keogh, featured an article on rubbish disposal in which it was stated, "One famous incin-

erator not only survived, but was heritage-listed and repurposed as the Incinerator Theatre. In 1934, Ipswich Council commissioned world-famous architect Walter Burley Griffin to design an industrial incinerator to solve their problem instead of smelly landfill."

Peeling Paint

During Bump-In for *Bondi Legal*, the set builders took the opportunity to strip the flats that normally form the back wall of our sets and replace the well-worn plywood cladding with new material and build some new ones. At the same time, cast and crew dealt with the permanent higher part of the

back wall which was installed in 2016 and had therefore been repainted at least 40 times. Not surprisingly, the paint came off in thick sheets like those being displayed by Liz Ball and Alison Lees.

Hopefully, it will be another ten years before further replacement will be necessary!
